

ANALYSIS ON FEEDBACK BY THE STUDENTS OF
YEAR- 2021-22

The department of Mathematics has conducted the feedback of the Honours students in the Honours room. The total number of students who had given their feedbacks are 12 from 3rd Semester and 15 from 5th Semester. Total 14 questions for the 3rd Semester and 16 questions for the 5th Semester Honours students were administered. The 3rd Semester Honours students gave feedback based on the syllabus of 1st and 2nd Semesters and the 5th Semester Honours students gave feedback based on the syllabus of 1st to 4th Semesters. Few numbers of questions were asked from each unit.

The questions were graded as shown below:


1. 4 – 85 to 100% (Excellent), carrying 4 points
2. 3 – 70 to 84% (Very Good) , carrying 3 points
3. 2 – 55 to 69% (Good), carrying 2 points
4. 1– 30 to 54% (Average) , carrying 1 points
5. 0 –Below 30% (Poor) , carrying 0 points.

The cumulative score is as follows :

The analysis led to the conclusion that the students have given maximum score in “Very Good” [Total Score for Very Good is 71 by 5th Semester Students and 55 by 3rd Semester Students=126], followed by “Excellent” [Total Score for Excellent is 74 by 5th Semester Students and 51 by 3rd Semester Students=125], “Good” with 67 (5th Semester) and 42 (3rd Semester) points, “Average” with 21 (5th Semester) and 12 (3rd Semester) points and “Poor” with 7 (5th Semester) and 3 (3rd Semester) points.

This analysis reveals that the students are happy with the syllabus, availability of books in the Library and the teaching environment in the college, but they are not sure with the application of the subject in their daily lives.



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
