

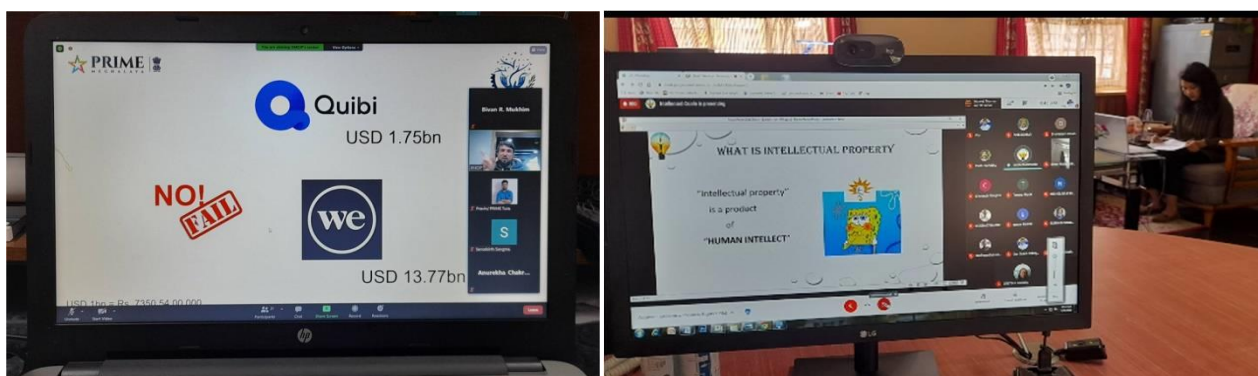
ANNUAL REPORT 2021

- The Red Ribbon Club- Don Bosco College, Tura under the aegis of Meghalaya Aids Control Society celebrated National Youth Day / Vivekananda Jayanti today, the 12th January 2021. The theme of this year's National Youth Day was *Youth for Nation Building* and the deliberations were on responsibilities of youth towards nation building woven together with health and life. While Fr. Bivan R. Mukhim, Principal, Don Bosco College Tura and Dr. Barbara S. Sangma, the Red Ribbon Club Nodal Officer of the College harped on youth and the ideals of Swami Vivekananda during the Inaugural function, the main thrust of the National Youth Day was Awareness on HIV & AIDS. The celebration was in two parts: the morning and afternoon sessions.

The Chief Guest of the Morning Session was Dr. Marwin R. Sangma, District Medical and Health Officer, West Garo Hills, Tura and he spoke on the spread of AIDS and the need to contain the malaise. He encouraged the students gathered for the programme that they do a lot to contribute to the over-all development of the country, beginning from creating awareness of HIV & AIDS. The Resource Persons Dr. Rajamoni Marak MD, I/C ICTC and STI/RTI and Nodal Officer ARTC, Tura Civil Hospital gave a comprehensive presentation on HIV & AIDS and Ms. Narbecca Momin, Clinical Psychologist, Tura Civil Hospital also made a presentation on Mental Health with particular reference to HIV & AIDS patients.



- A one-day Online Programme for the students of the college on 'Entrepreneur: Idea to Execution' was organised on Wednesday 13th January 2021 by PRIME (Promotion and Incubation of Market-driven Enterprises), a comprehensive programme launched by the Government of Meghalaya. The Online Programme was animated by Mr Flo Oberhofer, a social entrepreneur and Program Head of PRIME Start-up Hub seeks to create and promote an entrepreneurial ecosystem in the state. He has taken up the charge of mentoring aspiring start-ups that are based across a plethora of fields, industries, and are harbouring at diverse stages.



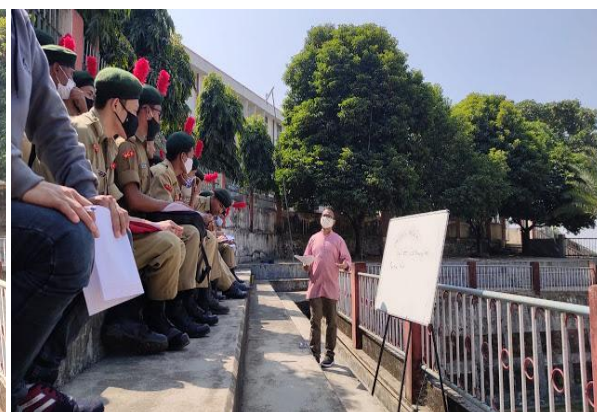
- An Orientation Programme for Morning Shift Asst. Professor was held on Monday 25th January 2021 at the Conference Hall, Don Bosco College, Tura. The orientation programme was animated by Fr. Bivan Rodrigues Mukhim, Principal and Fr. Abhilash V.J., Vice Principal.

Principal Fr. Bivan Rodrigues Mukhim presented about the college and discussed the various expectations of the morning shift teachers. He added that the morning shift of the college is in a mission mode. “The morning shift students needed us the most and we need to give the best to help the students succeed”, Fr. Bivan said. He added that the morning shift students will be given more opportunity so that they are able to grow and perform. Fr. Abhilash V.J., Vice Principal animated on the Preventive System of St. John Bosco. He based the presentation on the three pillars of Reason, Religion and Loving Kindness.



- The first Staff Meeting of the year was held on 9 February, 2021 and started with a short prayer by Miss Chichi Ch. Sangma followed by a Report of the previous meeting read out by Dr. Mueller Beul M. Sangma. The agenda included Service book, Time Table, NEHU Examinations 2021, Internal Assessment, AQAR 2019 - 2020 and Syllabus etc. Besides, issues and problems related to NAAC were also touched upon.

- SWA (Students Welfare Association) Election was conducted on the 3rd of March, 2021 to promote healthy corporate atmosphere in the college and to assist in maintaining proper academic, cultural and sports atmosphere and orderliness in the college. The office bearers of the Students Representatives were elected on 5th March, 2021. The students were given an idea about the formation of Association and the kind of responsibilities which they would need to shoulder as leaders. The Election was conducted in a transparent manner with only the students voting for their desired candidates.

The Principal, in his message shared his Views on Women that both men and women contribute to the betterment of society and play a vital role in upbringing of children. 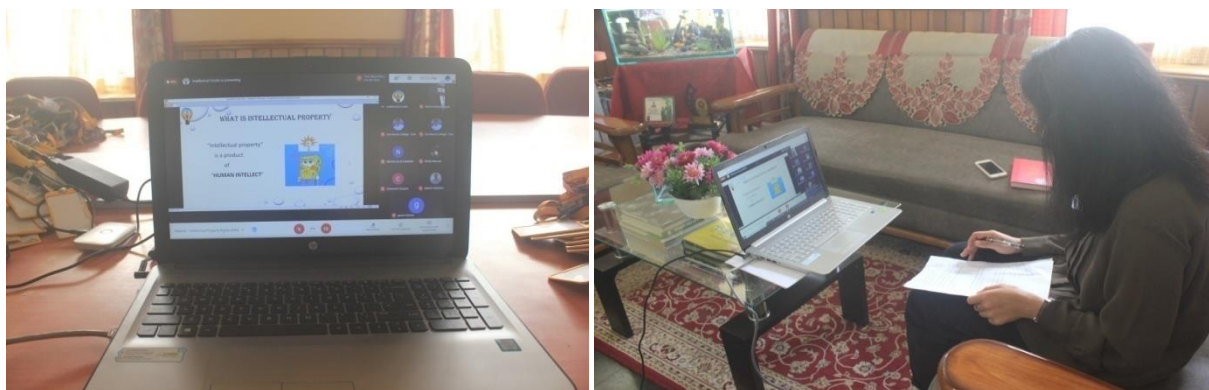

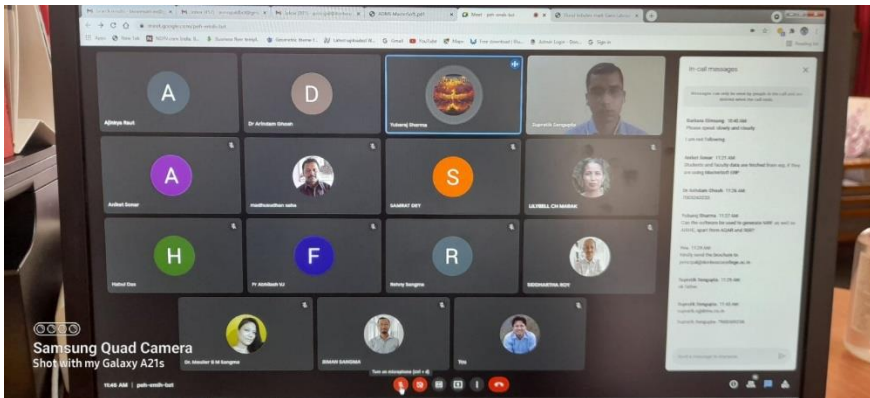

Yubaraj Sharma moderated the interactive session effectively while Miss Bulbul G. Momin, President, Students Welfare Association proposed the vote of thanks.

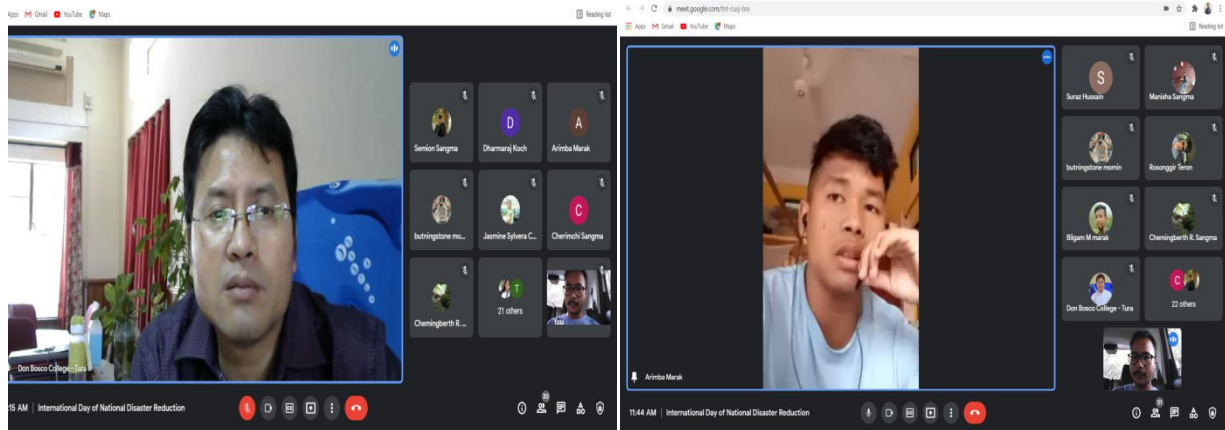
