The North-East NSS Festival 2020 was held from 20<sup>th</sup> to 25<sup>th</sup> of January 2020 in Don Bosco College, Tura. The festival was organised under the aegis of Regional Directorate of NSS, Guwahati with the collaboration of Don Bosco college, Tura and the active support from the Tura Government College, Durama College and Phukan Memorial College, Dalu.

DAY ONE: 20th January 2020

9:00 am-11:00 am: Registration

#### I/C Reception Committee & Volunteers at Venue

The NSS volunteers from Tura received the NSS volunteers from the eight states of North-East India. The volunteers then started registering themselves by 9am on 20<sup>th</sup> January 2020.

11:00 am-01:00 pm: Inaugural Programme

#### I/C Fr. Bivan Rodriques Mukhim & Programme Committee

The festival was ushered in amidst a soulful rendition of "Hallelujah" by Agape and Anne Balentina from Don Bosco College, Tura and flag hoisting was in perfect synchrony with the singing of the NSS Anthem led by the NSS volunteers of Tura Government College. The festival was attended by a little over 300 (three hundred) NSS volunteers from various colleges of the eight North-Eastern states of India.

Speaking on the occasion, the Chief Guest, Shri Anurag Kumar, IPS, DIG Western Range, Tura emphasized on selfless voluntary service and the necessity to give back to society what one has received. He cited the example of 'the good Samaritan' and urged the gathering to render generous service to those in need. Prof. Nikme S. C. Momin, HOD, Department of Education, NEHU Tura Campus, who was one of the Guests of Honour emphasized on self-preparation with a view to serve others. She reminded about inner preparation and garnering and reinforcing of inner strength in order to be of greater and better service to the community. Fr. Januarius S. Sangma, Salesian Provincial of the Province of Guwahati spoke about community service and expressed his great joy at the number of NSS volunteers and added that it is a sign of great hope for future. Dipak Sharma, Youth Officer, NSS, Regional Directorate, Guwahati highlighted the NSS Structure in general and NE NSS Festival 2020 in particular. Fr. Bivan Rodriques Mukhim, Principal, Don Bosco College, Tura welcomed the distinguished guests, Programme Officers and NSS volunteers and expressed his joy that such a festival was being held for the first time in Tura.

The NSS volunteers were entertained by Garo traditional *Wangala* dance and Garo song by the hosts. The Inauguration Programme came to an end with the singing of National Anthem by everyone present. The programme was compered by Dr. Barbara S. Sangma.











#### 2:00 pm-4:30 pm: Personality Development Session

On the first day of the North-East NSS Festival 2020, the first technical session was on the topic 'Personality Development'. The Resource Person was Mr. Sunil Basumatary, Freelance Motivational Speaker from Guwahati. He stressed on the need for incorporating personality development through community service under the Ministry of Youth Affairs & Sports. Reminding that NSS is a platform for self-transformation, he emphasized on creating awareness though NSS and added that better awareness can lead to better choices and better choices will in turn lead to better results. He also pointed out that through NSS one can develop speaking skills, confidence and leadership qualities. Heborrowed Tony Robins' statement 'Change your vocabulary and you change your personality' and tried to impress upon the NSS volunteers the need to change for the better.

The Resource Person also explained that NSS encompasses two programmes: 1. Regular activities and 2. Special Camping comprising seven (7) days Residential Programme, of which the latter directly helps to develop personality. Developing the habit of giving is important to develop inner personality. He also referred to the book "The Power of Giving" (by Azim Jamal) and exhorted to 1. Give with respect, 2. Give with humility, 3. Give unconditionally.

#### 06:00pm-08:00pm: Talent Show

North-East is known as repository of talents. It is the home of the likes of Mary Kom, Hima Das, Sourabhi Debbarma, Amit Paul, DebojitSaha, Angarag Mahanta with his stage-name Papon, and veterans like Bhupen Hazarika, Lou Majaw and others.

The NSS volunteers gathered for the **NSS Festival 2020** were a talented lot. They exhibited various talents such as singing, dancing, beat-boxing, rapping, traditional attire show, etc with great elan. The Talent Hunt proved to be colourful, innovative, creative, entertaining and on the whole superb display. The Chief Guest for the Talent Hunt was Prof. Deio Gracia, NSS Coordinator, NEHU, Shillong Campus who spoke expressing her happiness being with the students and encouraging them in their endeavour to serve others.

# DAY TWO: 21st January 2020

06:30am-07:00am Physical Exercise and Yoga

09:30am-11:00am: Personality Development Session

The first session of the day was a continuation on **Personality Development**, where Mr. Sunil Basumatary outlined the 7 keys to success: 1. Connecting to God, 2. Physical exercise, 3. Reading for half an hour, 4. Listening to inspirational CDs, 5. Meditation/relaxation, 6. Introspection, 7. Developing the habit of giving and doing what one likes. He also encouraged writing down one's goals and putting into practice what one has written down. He made a categorical statement that if one has written down the goals but has not executed them, then one has failed to achieve one's commitment. The set goals have to be SMART: S for Specific, M for Measurable, A for Achievable, R for Result-Oriented and T for Time-bound. One need not be good to start but start in order to be good. The speaker also said that to prove oneself, one needs to improve; and in order to be successful, the NSS volunteers need to plan out every single activity and also read books. The resource person also stressed the need of inculcating courage and belief in oneself.

#### 11:30am-01:00pm: Soft Skill & Personality Development

In the second session on **Soft Skill and Personality Development**, Mr. Sunil Basumatary exhorted the NSS volunteers to instil positive attitude in themselves. He explained that a positive attitude can be imbued in oneself by 1.Not complaining, 2. Being Honest and Giving Sincere Appreciation, 3. Getting the other Person Interested, 4. Becoming Genuinely Interested in Others, 5. Smiling, 6. Remembering people's Names, 7. Being a Good Listener, 8. Encouraging Others to Talk About Themselves, etc.

#### 2:30 pm-4:00 pm: Interview Techniques/Motivational Class

The third session of the day was on **Motivation** by Sunny Mawlong, MD, Hundredfold Academy, Shillong. He started off by making a very powerful statement: "You are capable of greatness". He then went on to enumerate the four key-points to achieve greatness:

- R-Respond (if one wants to achieve greatness, one needs to respond and not react),
- A-Active (one has to be proactive and come out of comfort zone),
- C-Change (embrace change to achieve greatness),
- E-Excellent (give the best and strive for excellence)







He went on to speak about three types of people: 1. I will, 2. I won't, 3. I can't.

And said that people can be divided into three sections:

- 1. The Un-movables,
- 2. Those who move only when pushed,
- 3. Those who needs just a start push.

He presented "C-H-E-A-T-E-D" to be the factors responsible for holding one back from being great:

- C-Comfort (Get out of the Comfort zone and embrace change)
- H-Hopelessness
- E-Effortless
- A-Attitude
- T-Time
- E-Ego
- **D-Disbelief**

Besides the various factors mentioned above, he specifically pointed out the alphabet A from CHEATED indicating Attitude which further determines Altitude. Mr. Sunny Mawlong concluded his first session with a motivational lyric video 'Run the Race' by Holly Starr.







A few lines from the song run thus:

'Deep in your soul, there is a fire And its burning, through the rain Quiet the fear, focus your eyes Don't you know that, you were made To run the race'

The song was an apt supplement for the session which focussed on running the race and it deeply captivated and stirred the minds of the volunteers.

# 04:30pm - 06:00pm: Problems of Youth Today/HIV and AIDS Awareness

The 4<sup>th</sup> session of the day was on **Problems of Youth Today/HIV and AIDS** by Dr. Narbecca Momin, Clinical Psychologist, Civil Hospital, Tura. The session started with a young girl who spoke about how she suffered from severe depression for three years but who came out of it within three months through proper clinical counselling. The session sent out a strong message that mental sickness is real. But there is help and those who suffer from mental sickness should seek the help of a qualified psychiatrist and psychologist. Dr.Narbecca Momin explained about mental illness and pointed out some it's symptoms:

- 1. Sleep disorder
- 2. Eating disorder
- 3. Lack of interest
- 4. Aggressiveness and negativity
- 5. Being talkative/isolation
- 6. Suicidal thoughts
- 7. Fear, anxiety and nervousness
- 8. Lack of concentration, and others.

She also emphasised on Specific Learning Disorder which includes Dyslexia, Dysgraphia and Dyscalculia. The speaker pointed out that people go to see a doctor for physical illness but they hardly go to see a physician for mental illnesses. She encouraged the volunteers to speak out about their problems or any of the symptoms of mental disorder they may find in themselves. Persons with mental illness should first acknowledge that they are ill and speak about it to people they trust. Speaking about fear of not being accepted she also touched upon issues like LGBT (Lesbian Gay Bisexual and Transgender) and the social stigma. However, the concerned person should not be subdued by social barriers but accept their true identity.

Thereafter, Dr. Narbecca interacted with the NSS volunteers and talked about the various problems that youth face, such as Bullying, Social-Media, Non-acceptability, Addiction, Peer-Pressure, etc.

# 11:30am-01:00pm: Interview Techniques/Motivational Class

The 2<sup>nd</sup> session by Mr. Sunny Mawlong was on Interview Techniques. He emphasised on the importance of Curriculum Vitae (CV). He made a categorical statement that the first impression at an Interview is what one presents in one's CV, then explained the distinction between CV and Resume. Mr. Mawlong explained that Curriculum Vitae (CV) is a detailed description of the candidate and should be of 8-9 pages. Whereas Resume is a brief description of the candidate and should not exceed 2 pages. He shared some points on how to make a Resume. The whole Resume should be typed in Times New Roman most preferably in black or navy-blue font colour. The whole Resume should not contain upper cases apart from the initial letters of the significant words. The passport-sized photograph should have a white background and the candidate should present himself or herself well groomed. Resume and CV should match with career objective and must include work experience(s), Academic record: from the highest to the lowest (preferably in table form), Hobbies/Leisure, Extra-curricular activities and Personal profile.

The page should be divided into left, centre and right. The name of the candidate should be at the top centre of the page while the address should be at the left side of the page. The contact details, preferably two contact numbers, along with email address should be at the right.



The name and contact details should be typed in 16-18 font size and the name of the candidate should be in bold black letters. The Resume should not contain abbreviated forms like BA or MA instead it should be written as Bachelor of Arts or Master of Arts respectively. At the end of the Resume, the personal profile of the candidate with his name, date of birth and mother's name/father's name should be included. The candidate appearing for the interview should display correct posture and disposition.

#### 02:00 pm-04:00 pm: Youth Counselling

Smt. Balmuri K. Marak, Deputy Director, Meghalaya Board of School Education conducted a session on "Youth Counselling" from 2:00 to 4:00 PM. She spoke on Management of Emotions, Expression of Emotions and stated that dealing with emotions can lead to self-awareness. She stressed that we should express, accept and acknowledge our emotions. In the course of her session she also conducted Group exercises based on the following issues:-

1. Domestic violence, 2. Sexual abuse, 3. Failure in exam and 4. Conflict in relationship intended for marriage. She explained at great length about Suppression and Containment of emotions and also highlighted the Short term and Long-Term resolutions of the two.

Dr. Barbara S. Sangma, Nodal Officer, Red Ribbon Club and Head and Assistant Professor, Department of English, Don Bosco College Turaconducted aMotivational Session and captured the interest of the volunteers by her bilingual delivery in English and Hindi. She played around the Latin terminology 'obportu', which is the origin for the English word 'opportunity'. Stating "Expect nothing for nothing will be given except chance", she went onto stress on recognizing chance/opportunity that comes in the garb of work. She pointed that the time NOW is also called PRESENT, which means the present moment is a gift and urged the volunteers to make best use of the opportunity by looking into the future rather than fretting about the past.

Exhorting the young volunteers on personal preparation, she introduced the Greek concept of 'agoge' which stands for the Spartan way of training: "One who sweats more during training, bleeds less in the battle." She made an effort to associate preparation with service and sense of personal responsibility. In order to drive home her message, she quoted from an unknown source: "If I am not a part of the solution, I am a part of the problem." Like the other resource persons, she also stressed on the need to step out from the comfort zone and embrace the unfamiliar, unknown, unpredictable, etc. she motivated the volunteers to stick out their neck like a turtle in order to move ahead and advance in life.

# NSS Programme on Capacity Building on Leadership and Personality Development for Colleges of Garo Hills at Don Bosco College, Tura



Personality Development through Life Skills started months before the actual days of the Programme. The POs of Don Bosco College, Tura, Tura Government College and Durama College had their first and second meetings on 30<sup>th</sup> September 2019 and 2<sup>nd</sup> October 2019 respectively. POs of Williamnagar and Dalu too joined for the meeting. The meeting saw the POs engaged in brain-storming, planning and serious discussion to make the Five Days Capacity Building on Leadership and Personality Development on Life Skill Programme and the NSS NorthEast Festival scheduled for the month of January 2020 a success. Most of the delegates for the Programme arrived at the venue on 4<sup>th</sup> November morning except the delegates from Captain Williamson, Baghmara who arrived on Sunday, 3<sup>rd</sup> November. After the morning breakfast, the delegates registered themselves for the Programme.

#### DAY ONE: 4th November 2019 (Monday)

The Five Day Residential NSS Programme Capacity Building of Youth on Leadership and Personality Development through Life Skills was inaugurated on 4<sup>th</sup> November 2019 at 10:00 am in Bosco Hall, Don Bosco College, Tura. Altogether 50 NSS volunteers from different colleges of Garo Hills registered themselves for the Programme. At the inaugural Programme a few NSS volunteers of Don Bosco College, Tura were also present.

The Chief Guest of the Inaugural Programme was Shri Ramakrishna Chitturi IAS, ADC, West Garo Hills, Meghalaya. In his speech he encouraged the students to develop the skills needed in their lives. He motivated the students to distinguish between Empathy and Sympathy. He spoke on the need to develop problem-solving skills, creative-thinking skills and self-awareness. He added that one should always strive to be better and aim higher in life. The Guest of Honour, Prof. C.P Suresh, Head Department of Horticulture, NEHU Tura Campus spoke on being an entrepreneur and developing the skill towards achieving it. He shared life experiences on how young people have become successful after starting their own businesses. He encouraged students to think about their future and dream confidently about success. Fr. Bivan Rodrigues Mukhim, Principal welcomed the dignitaries and participants and wished the Programme a success. Shri Terence D Marak, Principal Tura Government College, Tura, Programme Officers (POs) of Tura Government College, Tura, Durama College, Tura and Don Bosco College, Tura were present at the Programme. The NSS Volunteers of Don Bosco College presented a welcome song and sang a prayer song. During the Inaugural Programme the NSS Volunteers pledged themselves to maintain unity and integrity in the country. #### DAY TWO: 5<sup>th</sup> November 2019 (Tuesday)

The Second day of the NSS Programme started with the morning exercises at 6:00 am. Shri Krittarson Nengminza, PO Durama College along with Fr. Bivan Rodriques Mukhim, Principal Don Bosco College, Tura were present at the Basketball Court for the jogging and exercise. Breakfast was served at 8:00 am and at 9:00 am, the volunteers gathered in the Bosco Hall for the fourth session. The session started with a prayer led by Fr. Bivan Rodriques Mukhim on the theme of UNITY. He animated the prayer service asking all the volunteers to be united and to ask God to help everyone to work towards unity regardless of their diverse cultures, food habits, languages etc.

After the morning prayer, Shri Mandeng A Momin, Secretary AEA, Tura took the session on **COMMUNICATION.** He started his session by posing some thought-provoking questions to the NSS Volunteers. At 11:30 am, Smt. Ratna Singh took a session on **DECISION MAKING**. Through various activities she involved the students to prepare the various charts and presented them before the groups. The students were divided into five groups of 10 members each. What we see through the session is the active involvement of the volunteers and the creativity in which they presented the charts. The volunteers were asked to conceptualize the ideas and dream they have for the country and through the help of the chart present their concepts. Beautiful paintings, sketches, flow charts, collage, etc. were presented by the volunteers. The different activities and the different steps followed helped the students the need and importance of timely and good decision making.

At 1:00 pm, the class went for lunch and at 2:00 pm another session on **PROBLEM SOLVING** was held. Smt. Ratna Singh animated the session on **Problem Solving**, helping the volunteers to come out with the best. The volunteers prepared the chart on solving problem of the youth in North-east India and Garo Hills, in particular.
