For an effective and regular teaching-learning process, the College has triple-tiered supervision system and mentoring of each student.

3. Context (in about 150 words)?:

Don Bosco College is guided by the education principles of St. John Bosco who advocated continual adult supervision through the teachers and the Principal/ Vice Principal among the young people under their care. Following in the footsteps of its Father and Founder, Don Bosco, the College Management believes that it is far better to supervise the students by being with them in person than to correct them after they have committed a mistake. This has prompted the College to offer continual and effective supervision to students under the triple-tiered system.

The students are in their formative stage and many of them are from rural areas staying in hostels and rented houses. Being away from home they need extra guidance and the College has risen to the occasion by according the students supervision and mentoring that they need.

4. The practice (in about 400 words):

Two of the Best Practices of the College are made manifest in the form of a) Triple-tiered Supervision and b) Regular Mentoring.

Right from the inception of the College in 1987, a triple-tiered supervision was set in motion. In this system all the three machinery involved are interrelated and interdependent and mutually responsible. Under this mechanism of supervision which is aimed at effective teaching-learning, at the start of every class, an office designated for the purpose goes to every class to find out if a teacher is present. Should a teacher fails to make it to class due to any reason, the matter is taken before the Management and a substitute is arranged. In this way no class is left unattended. The purpose of this practice is cultivation of personal responsibility and contribution to regular classes and smooth running of the College. At the second level, the students are supervised by the teachers in and outside the

class. While learning-based discipline is imposed within the classroom, the teachers continue to exert their gentle yet persistent presence by helping the students to adhere to the rules and regulations of the College. All the teachers, especially those in the Discipline and Anti Ragging Committee see to the day to day discipline of the College, such as use of mobile phones only within the permissible areas of the College campus. This triple-tiered supervision sees at its apex the regular supervision accorded by the Management . The Principal and the Vice- Principal patrols the classes assuring the students and even the staff of their presence. The whole College has come to look towards this supervision with a welcoming attitude. This caring supervision is augmented by mentoring that is conducted to students. Mentoring is seen to take place at various levels. There is the mentoring that is conducted officially both in groups and individually. In addition to this, students approach teachers of their choice as and when they feel the need of a listening ear. Teachers also resort to unsolicited mentoring whenever they feel that any student is need of their particular help and advice. The periodic Morning Assemblies conducted by the College also serves in general to remind and direct the students towards the right path.

5. Evidence of Success

The practice of positive triple-tiered supervision of classes is seen to be successful. It has made everyone concerned understand the values of regularity and punctuality followed by spontaneous execution. This has helped in the smooth and effective teaching-learning process. The official introduction of mentoring system have made the students aware of the College's is interest in their over-all welfare. This has resulted in improvement of class attendance and over-all learning. Along with this, the unofficial mentoring accorded to students has helped teachers get to know their students more closely and help and understand them accordingly. f

To conduct this program, general information is sent out to all students of the department informing them of the services extended by the cell and inviting them to meet the faculty coordinators of the departments. The departments already had conducted two cycles or rounds of mentoring. The Mentoring Coordinator provided guidelines for the mentors on which the mentees can be assisted or mentored. The students are encouraged to seek guidance on academic, general or psychological issues, if necessary. Also, semester wise results are discussed to find out the students who are below average or poor. The students are advised to improve performance and are given suggestions for clearing their arrear papers. The advising process also helps to identify and solve problems the student may be confronting in achieving the educational objectives. The students are encouraged to meet the teachers to seek guidance on any matter related to academic performance to discuss any issues related to the course, student problems, and advice them on all matters as desired related to academic, placement, industrial training and career goals.

Best Practices in Higher Education for Quality Management

BEST PRACTICES IN MY INSTITUTION

Institutions may have many good practices that add value to the quality of education they offer. For presentation of each of those practices the following format may be used. Care may be taken to avoid general descriptions and focus may be on concrete practice.

- 1. Title of the practice: MENTORING
- 2. The context that required the initiation of the practice

Don Bosco College, Tura is one of the premier institutions in Garo Hills. We can even say that it is one of the best colleges in Meghalaya. So many students irrespective of caste, sex, religion, financial background, urban, rural come to take admission to this college. It has students studying in 15 departments of the three streams of Arts, Science and Commerce with a total strength of about 1800 students. The affiliating university, NEHU, in its regulations on conduct of examinations of the three year degree courses has laid the qualification of candidates for examinations a minimum of 75% attendance of the candidate in the lecture/tutorials and practical classes. The college has a wide variation in the student population in regard to educational and economic background and because of these factors, the IQAC of this college introduce the mentoring system and take it as a priority to entertain the hopes and aspirations of students from all over the State. Many of our students from rural areas lack proper academic background and financial backup. Mentoring of students thus, is an essential feature to render equitable service to all our students having varied background. The importance and aims of student mentoring is to enhance teacher-student relationship, to enhance students' academic performance and attendance and discipline, to minimise student drop-out rates, to identify and understand the status of slow learners and encourage advanced learners and to render equitable service to students. This reinforces the IQAC to introduce a program called "MENTORING".

3. Objectives of the practice The College regularly monitors the attendance of the students to determine students consistency in attending classes, to reduce absenteeism, to identify potential reasons for absence of students, to boost students' productivity in teaching-learning process. The follow up of attendance is done through Mentoring program which helps to identify the individual students who encounter various problems in their academic life. This identification will help to strengthen and overcome their issues. It also helps in establishing good rapport between the teacher and the student and thus builds an interpersonal relationship between the teachers and students. Each department is assigned with the task of mentoring their Honours students. This programme is conducted at two levels; group and individual. All teachers conduct at least three cycles of group and individual mentoring every semester. All mentors keep a confidential data sheet about their students, "mentors assessment of students" which records a report of mentoring done by the teachers. These reports are periodically monitored and evaluated by IQAC members and the Mentoring Coordinator.

4. The Practice

Attendance data of all the students is compiled by the departments on a monthly basis. Cumulative percentages are calculated and displayed on the notice board at the beginning of each month. Students falling short of the required attendance percentage are notified to meet the principal. Show cause notices are sent to the parents of those students that do not reach the 30% attendance mark. The Mentoring Program provides a reliable support system from within the departments and for the student community in order to motivate them to excel in both academic and non-academic fields. This Mentoring help the students in need and the departmental teachers are ready to serve anytime and in any form. It also helps students to improve their skills, attitudes, and resources necessary to succeed, both in the college environment as well as to pursue comfortable, easy and satisfying lives. To show respect for Principals, teachers and elders are always insisted by mentors. Even students diversity is taken into account by the mentors. Each department is assigned with the task of mentoring their Honours students. This programme is conducted at two levels; group and individual. All teachers conduct at least three cycles of group and individual mentoring every semester. The session is compulsory for every B.A, B. Sc and B.Com students to attend without fail. The mentoring parameters are based on four aspects i.e. academic, attendance, discipling and

motivation. A Mentoring Format with Guidelines is prepared by the IQAC and the Mentoring Coordinator to ensure uniformity. Mentors maintain the Mentoring Format which contains space for entering particulars and performance of students (internal tests, monthly attendance records, etc.) All mentors keep a confidential data sheet about their students, "mentors assessment of students" which records a report of mentoring done by the teachers. Hence through the process of mentoring, the students are motivated to become more regular for their classes and thus the target of making students achieve 75% attendance is fulfilled. The grievances of the mentees are taken up by the mentors and if necessary it is forwarded to the Principal for necessary remedial actions. The reports of the practice of the mentoring system are periodically monitored and evaluated by IQAC members and the Mentoring Coordinator so as to ensure quality and efficiency in practice.

5. Obstacles faced if any and strategies adopted to overcome them

Obstacle 1: A mentoring program conducted in the college within 45 minutes is not something that a teacher can just throw together in a short amount of time and expect to produce results.

Strategies: To make sure that the mentors have a plan in their minds to alleviate this initial anxiety. This plan should contain both a process that outlines how a mentor intent to proceed, and a methodology that confirms not only what mentors are doing but also why they are doing it. So the mentors must remember to plan.

Obstacle 2: What is a mentor? What is a mentee? What is mentoring overall? These types of questions should not be vague.

Strategies: To make sure that all the teachers are well versed with the operational definitions of the terms "Mentor", "Mentee", "Mentoring" etc.

6. Impact of the practice

Attendance forms a part of the Continuous Evaluation process and hence some marks are awarded to those students having a good performance in attendance. Attendance data has been used by the concerned teachers to help identify and mentor the students and thereby

PRINCIPAL DON BOSCO COLLEGE TUTA 701 helping them to do better in their performance in the classroom as well as examinations. The Principal himself takes the responsibility to personally call the students with very low attendance and meet their parents. Mentoring College students by the faculty (mentor) has a positive impact on students' academic achievement, discipline, attendance and motivation. Mentoring relationships frequently develop between mentors and mentees. In this process, the stories that students share about their life issues alleviates their problems as the mentors offer them with various suggestions and remedies to solve their issues which is hindering their academic success. The system has been useful in identifying slow learners and advanced learners.

7. Resources required

The primary attendance is taken in the classes using the register/file. The data are entered into a computer by the respective departments in a MS Excel attendance data format which is submitted to the office, who then computes the percentages of the students' attendance. This data is printed and displayed on the notice board in the 1st week of each month. Free resources for training mentors for mentoring programs should be provided in the college. Any expert mentoring personnel with established mentoring programs can also assist with training activities for the mentors in the institution.
